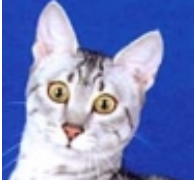
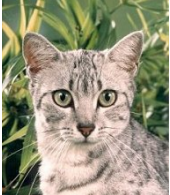


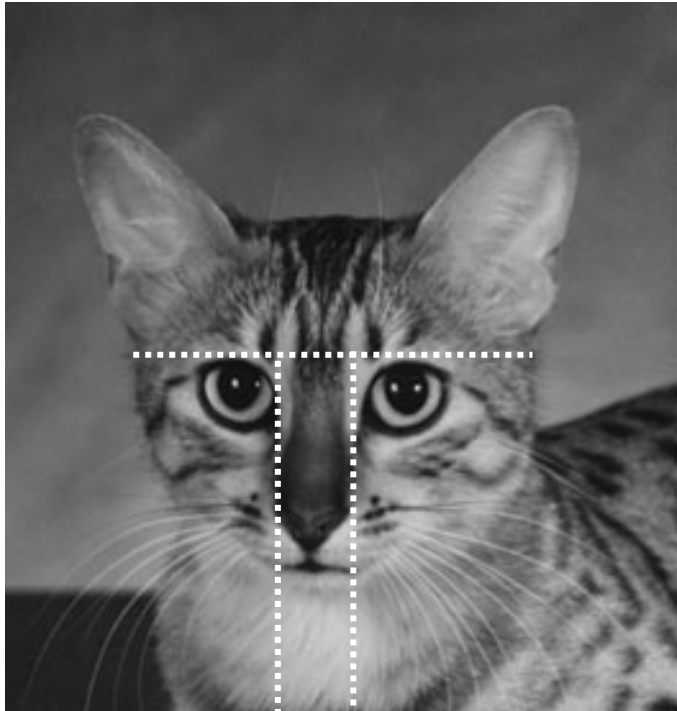
Egyptian Mau: correct ear set

The ears of the Egyptian Mau are described in the GCCF Standard of Points as follows:

“**Medium to moderately large**. Broad at the base and **moderately pointed, slightly flared** with **ample width between** them. Set well back on the head, but **cupped forward and alert**. From a front view, the line of the ears should **continue the planes of the head**. Hair on the ears should be short and close lying. May be tufted.”

Egyptian Mau: correct head type.



The unique “worried” look:

- *Large, rounded almond-shaped eyes;*
- *Level brow;*
- *Parallel lines to nose.*

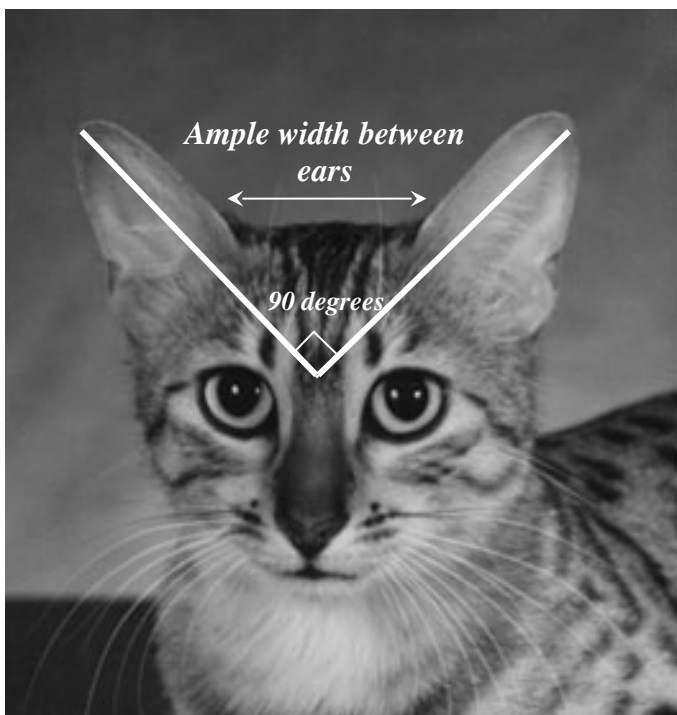
Faults:

- *Lines of nose diverge.*
- *Ornate mustache.*

Gently rounded muzzle flows into the lines of the head.

Faults:

- *Square or pointed muzzle;*
- *Whisker pinch;*
- *Weak chin.*



Ears:

- *Medium to moderately large;*
- *Slightly flared;*
- *Ample width between;*
- *Continue planes of head.*

Faults:

- *Small ears.*
